

10 years of history of PIURN

Initially named Pacific Islands Universities Research Network, PIURN was officially established in 2013 when Universities from the Pacific Islands countries and territories collectively decided to dramatically joint efforts and work together at enhancing their capability to address the challenges faced by the region.

PIURN carries the voice of Pacific Islands universities acknowledging their unique responsibility for the training of the future Pacific workforce and the new generation of Pacific researchers.

PIURN's vision is the one of empowered Pacific Islands universities fully equipped and able to deliver on the sustainable development goals agenda, for the direct benefit of Pacific people, communities and stakeholders. For 10 years, with 14 Members Universities, they managed to support the development of closer collaboration amongst their researchers and academics while addressing social priorities, economic growth and environmental challenges in the Pacific Region. PIURN strengthened the cooperation between Pacific Universities, connecting between languages, geographies and cultures across the sea of islands.

Co-chaired by the University of the South Pacific (USP) and the University of New Caledonia (UNC), PIURN is labelled by the United Nations as a Sustainable Development Goals Action: #SDGAction39993.







PIURN achievements

Since 2017, a PIURN Call for Proposals launched by UNC and USP funded 17 Research collaborative projects:

- 9 PIURN Members Universities Involved
- 12 External partners including 3 Members of CRESICA (Consortium for Research, Innovation and Higher Education in New Caledonia) – 3 Australians Universities – 3 New Zealand Universities
- 2 534 000 euros attracted for research grants, following PIURN Projects
- 14 publications
- 9 communications in regional or international conferences and workshops
- 50+ students involved in the research work of the PIURN projects
- 7 full-time internships with thesis.

PIURN also contributed to the development of a regional initiative coordinated by SPC Pacific Data Hub.

Major global visibility is given to the PIURN network through the project on migrations and climate change and especially the 52-minutes documentary "Nations of Water" (English and French) which explores climate-induced migration in the Pacific and interrogates the legal aspect of these migrations.

PIURN, a catalyst for regional initiative

Regional Joint Masters' Degree in Sustainable Sciences (USP and UNC), part of ITN SUDPAC

The University of New Caledonia (UNC) and he University of the South Pacific (USP) established the first Regional Master's degree on Sustainability Sciences which is part of the ITN project SUDPAC aiming to enhance academic cooperation at Master and PhD level within PIURN and train and equip the future regional workforce (scientists, leaders, environmental stakeholders and practitioners).

Focus on FALAH Project

Following a PIURN-funded project, the University of New Caledonia has been granted 1.3 million euros from the European Commission

Horizon 2020 – RISE program for establishing the FALAH 'Family Farming, Lifestyle and Health' scientific network, together with PIURN members (USP, SINU and NUV), and research institutions from Australia and Europe. This dynamic will also explore the territories of Papua New Guinea. This multidisciplinary project, aligned with the SGDs, will address the impact of climate change on food security and practice of the Pacific population's health.



PIURN conferences

2014, The University of New Caledonia organized the 1st PIURN Conference with the theme"'Oceanians' new relationships with their land and environment: belonging versus property"

National University of Samoa hosted the 2nd PIURN Conference, on 19-21 September 2016. The theme was "Addressing the Challenges of Sustainability in the Pacific Islands"

The University of French Polynesia organized the 3rd Conference: 8-10 October 2018, with the theme "Traditional knowledge, academic

knowledge and current universities' research dynamics in the Pacific region"

Solomon Islands National University Conference: 22-23 November 2021 – Online – Coorganized with UNC and USP- General theme "Shaping our Tomorrow Today: Research, Innovation and Practice in the Pacific

The University of the South Pacific Cook Islands Campus is hosting the 5th PIURN Conference, on 4-6 July 2023, with the theme "Exploring this Sea of Islands", which will also celebrate the 10-year anniversary of the network.

PIURN - the next ten years

With 15 Members Universities from the Pacific Islands Countries and Territories, PIURN is identified today as a powerful lever for the development of regional research and training initiatives in and for the Pacific Region.

Recently renamed Pacific Islands Universities Regional Network, the consortium wishes to broaden the scope of its action and to strengthen its impact at the regional level.
